

Our Complex Care Unit provides specialized health care to children, ages newborn to 20 years old, with complex medical needs. The patients served in this unit often present with chronic health conditions and require ongoing medical care. We strive to provide this care in the least restrictive environment possible, focusing on habilitative and/or rehabilitative care based on each patient's needs. The average length of stay for patients in the Complex Care Unit is 24 months.

The interdisciplinary team in the Complex Care Unit provides specialized, post-acute healthcare to children with complex medical needs. The Complex Care program supports the patient's health and developmental growth in a nurturing, stimulating environment.

Staff includes physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, respiratory therapists, rehabilitative therapists, dietitians, and social workers. Our team evaluates each patient's needs and abilities to provide an individualized plan of care, and collaborates with families, specialists, and community healthcare providers for a safe, successful transition from hospital to home.

Patients may require care for congenital conditions, complications due to prematurity, traumatic accidents, or medically-complex illnesses. We treat patients who range from newborn to 20 years old; the average length of stav is 24 months.

Patients may have some of the following conditions:

- Cerebral Palsy
- Neuromuscular disorders
- Brain injury or stroke
- Spinal cord injuries
- Complex congenital heart disease
- Feeding difficulties
- Genetic disorders
- Severe Epilepsy
- Chronic lung conditions
- Complex post-surgical care
- Spinal muscular dystrophy
- Use of mechanical ventilator
